f) Approve increases of \$250,000 to the cost contingency and 50 calendar days to the duration contingency for Contract No. HH-1011, O'Shaughnessy Dam Instream Flow Release Valve Replacement with Sierra Mountain Construction, Inc., for a revised cost limit of \$6,806,000, and a revised duration limit of 749 calendar days (approximately two years and one month), for additional costs and schedule impacts related to the installation of two new vent pipes to address unexpected cavitation during high-flow releases, as well as differing site conditions that may arise from rising river level during runoff season, and potential issues with the as-built information.
