Lobbyist Registration and Reporting Requirements: Individuals and entities that influence or attempt to influence local legislative or administrative action may be required by the San Francisco Lobbyist Ordinance [SF Campaign & Governmental Conduct Code §2.100] to register and report lobbying activity. CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

 - a) [Approve Modification No. 1 to Job Order Contract No. JOC-104](#), General Engineering (A License) Construction, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne Counties, Hetch Hetchy, with Peterson Excavation, Inc., to increase the contract not-to-exceed amount by \$2,500,000, and increase the contract duration by three years, for a revised not-to-exceed contract amount of \$7,500,000 and a total contract duration of five years, to provide additional time and capacity for facility and asset improvements.  - b) [Approve Modification No. 1 to Job Order Contract No. JOC-102R](#), General Engineering (A License) Construction, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne Counties, Hetch Hetchy, with Pacific Engineering & Construction, Inc., to increase the contract duration by three years, for a total contract duration of five years, with no change to the contract amount, to provide additional time for facility and asset improvements.  - c) [Approve Amendment No. 3 to Contract No. PRO.0181, Westside Pump Station Construction Management Staff Augmentation Services, with MCK Americas, Inc.](#), increasing the contract amount by \$600,000, and increasing the contract duration by one year and six months, for a total not-to-exceed contract amount \$3,900,000 and a total contract duration of six years, to provide continued construction management staff-augmentation services to reflect the extension in construction duration for construction Contract No. WW-645R, Westside Pump Station Reliability Improvements.  - d) [Approve an increase of 76 calendar days to the duration contingency for Contract](#)

- [No. WW-725](#), Various Locations Sewer Replacement No. 14, with JDB & Sons Construction, Inc., for a revised duration limit of 617 calendar days (approximately one year and eight months), to allow for additional time to complete all contract work due to differing and unforeseen site conditions, with no change to the contract amount or amount contingency. - e) [Accept work performed by M. Squared Construction, Inc., under Contract No. WD-2896](#), 12-Inch Ductile Iron Water Main Installation on Webster Street from Grove Street to Eddy Street; **approve** Modification No. 3 (Final) decreasing the contract amount by \$21,960 and increasing the contract duration by 24 calendar days, for a total contract amount of \$1,698,480, and a total contract duration of 338 consecutive calendar days (approximately ten months), to adjust the final contract amount to the value of actual contract quantities and adjust the final contract duration to renew an additional water service and perform final pavement restoration; and **authorize** final payment to the contractor. - f) [Award Contract No. WW-767R, Southeast Water Pollution Control Plant Booster Station Interim Improvements](#), to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Mountain Cascade, Inc., in the amount of \$19,339,195 and with a duration of 880 consecutive calendar days (approximately two years and five months), to extend the useful life of the Booster Station by addressing structural, mechanical, electrical, and health & safety improvements. [Approve an increase of 602 calendar days \(approximately one year and eight months\) to the duration contingency for Contract No. WW-645R, with Anvil Builders, Inc.](#), for a revised duration limit of 2,264 calendar days (approximately six years and three months) to address procurement, site civil and structural work, system integration, and third-party

(Pacific Gas and Electric Company) delays in providing electric service, with no change to the contract amount or amount contingency. (Robinson)
