- b) Award Contract No. WW-727, Various Locations Sewer Replacement No. 16, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Precision Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$8,702,449 and with a duration of 580 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and seven months) to replace/line existing sewers on specified streets in the City and County of San Francisco. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 31.04(h). The Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on that determination to make its decision on this action. (Not applicable)
- c) Award Contract No. PRO.0289, As-Needed River Ecosystem Science Services, to Applied River Sciences, for an amount not to exceed \$4,000,000 and with a duration of eight years, to provide the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission Natural Resources and Lands Management Division professional services to support river ecosystem science and management efforts. 10. Approve Amendments No. 1 to Contract Nos. PRO.0231.A-D, Specialized and Technical As-Needed Services, with Stantec/JHCE Joint Venture (JV) (PRO.0231.A), MMD JV (PRO.0231.B), AECOM/WRE JV (PRO.0231.C), and Lee Incorporated (PRO.0231.D), increasing each contract amount by \$5,500,000 to address the higher than anticipated contract usage rate, due to an increased need for consulting resources with highly specialized skillsets, as well as an increased need for significant changes to infrastructure and asset management practices, and environmental and regulatory requirements, for a new total not-to-exceed contract amount of \$13,000,000 for each contract, with no increase to the contract duration, subject to the Board of Supervisors approval pursuant to Charter Section 9.118.

Commissioner Jamdar requested to have a Commission briefing on the San Francisco City Climate Action Plan, to schedule a public hearing and report on how SFPUC agency goals align with the plan, and Commissioner Jamdar commented on the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD) zero-NOx rules (to eliminate the emissions of nitrogen oxides) that phases out gas appliances, and added that she would like the hearing to include its impact on the affordable housing strategy for the Power Enterprise and CleanPowerSF.

Commissioner Arce reported on his tour of Mountain Tunnel last week and expressed appreciation to SFPUC staff for information shared and the work performed to host multiple commissioner tours; the Commissioner also reported on his February 18<sup>th</sup> visit with the Citizens' Advisory Committee (CAC) concerning topics that include Treasure Island power outages, Tuolumne River water policy, the salmon population and habitat

restoration, design drought methodology, and water use. Commissioner Arce stated that he is committed to working with SFPUC staff to partner with and develop short- and long-term solutions for the Treasure Island Development Authority (TIDA), while acknowledging limitations for SFPUC as a non-owner of the electric grid and recognizing all the work performed by SFPUC staff over the years, he will continue to attend CAC meetings monthly until a written response to the resolution is provided.
