Lobbyist Registration and Reporting Requirements: Individuals and entities that influence or attempt to influence local legislative or administrative action may be required by the San Francisco Lobbyist Ordinance [SF Campaign & Governmental Conduct Code §2.100] to register and report lobbying activity. CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code: If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

- a) **Award [Contract No. PW-008R](#)** Moscone West Solar to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Albion Power Company, Inc., in the amount of \$4,293,002 and with a duration of 240 consecutive calendar days (approximately eight months) to construct a rooftop solar electric system (837 kW/DC) located at 800 Howard Street, San Francisco, 94103. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 31.04(h). The San Francisco Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on the determination to make its decision on this action. (Hale)
- b) **Award [Contract No. HH-1022](#)**, Cherry Valley Dam Spillway Short-Term Improvement and Eleanor Dam Bridge Interim Repair, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Njirich & Sons, Inc., in the amount of \$8,674,300, and with a contract duration of 455 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and three months), to re-establish the flow path of the Cherry Valley Dam spillway which was damaged in a spill event in 2010, and to repair the concrete and replace the bridge deck overlay of the Eleanor Dam Bridge. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Eleanor Dam Bridge Interim Repair Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 31.04(h). The San Francisco Planning Department has determined that the Eleanor Dam Bridge Interim Repair Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on the determination to make its decision on this action. (Robinson)

- c) **Award** [Contract No. WD-2886](#), University Mound Reservoir North Basin Roof Coating, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Angelus Waterproofing and Restoration, Inc., in the amount of \$2,838,777 and with a duration of 154 consecutive calendar days (approximately five months), to recoat the entirety of the University Mound Reservoir north basin roof slab.
