6. **CONSENT CALENDAR**

- a) Award Contract No. PW-008R Moscone West Solar to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Albion Power Company, Inc., in the amount of \$4,293,002 and with a duration of 240 consecutive calendar days (approximately eight months) to construct a rooftop solar electric system (837 kW/DC) located at 800 Howard Street, San Francisco, 94103. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 31.04(h). The San Francisco Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on the determination to make its decision on this action.

- b) Award Contract No. HH-1022, Cherry Valley Dam Spillway Short-Term Improvement and Eleanor Dam Bridge Interim Repair, to the responsible bidder that submitted the lowest responsive bid, Njirich & Sons, Inc., in the amount of \$8,674,300, and with a contract duration of 455 consecutive calendar days (approximately one year and three months), to re-establish the flow path of the Cherry Valley Dam spillway which was damaged in a spill event in 2010, and to repair the concrete and replace the bridge deck overlay of the Eleanor Dam Bridge. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Eleanor Dam Bridge Interim Repair Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 31.04(h). The San Francisco Planning Department has determined that the Eleanor Dam Bridge Interim Repair Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on the determination to make its decision on this action.
