**Lobbyist Registration and Reporting Requirements:** Individuals and entities that influence or attempt to influence local legislative or administrative action may be required by the San Francisco Lobbyist Ordinance [SF Campaign & Governmental Conduct Code §2.100] to register and report lobbying activity. **CEQA Appeal Rights under Chapter 31 of the San Francisco Administrative Code:** If the Commission's action on a project constitutes the Approval Action for that project (as defined in S.F. Administrative Code Chapter 31, as amended, Board of Supervisors Ordinance Number 161-13), then the CEQA determination prepared in support of that Approval Action is thereafter subject to appeal within the time frame specified in S.F. Administrative Code Section 31.16. Typically, an appeal must be filed within 30 calendar days of the Approval Action for a project that has received an exemption or negative declaration pursuant to CEQA. For information on filing an appeal under Chapter 31, contact the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors at City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton B. Goodlett Place, Room 244, San Francisco, CA 94102, or call (415) 554-5184. If the Planning Department's Environmental Review Officer has deemed a project to be exempt from further environmental review, an exemption determination has been prepared and can be obtained on-line at <http://www.sf-planning.org/index.aspx?page=3447>. Under CEQA, in a later court challenge, a litigant may be limited to raising only those issues previously raised at a hearing on the project or in written correspondence delivered to the Board of Supervisors, Planning Commission, Planning Department or San Francisco Public Utilities Commission at, or prior to, such hearing, or as part of the appeal hearing process on the CEQA decision.

## 6. CONSENT CALENDAR

a) **Approve** Modification No. 1 to Job Order [Contract No. JOC-109R](#), General Engineering (A License) Construction, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, and Tuolumne Counties, Hetch Hetchy, with Njirich & Sons Inc., to increase the contract not-to-exceed amount by \$2,500,000, for a revised not-to-exceed contract amount of \$7,500,000, with no change to the contract duration, to provide additional capacity for facility and asset improvements. (Robinson)

b) **Approve** Modification No. 1 to Job Order [Contract No. JOC-106](#), Landscape (C-27 License), Micro-LBE Set-Aside, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Alameda Counties, with Korotkin Associates, to increase the contract duration by three years for a revised contract duration of five years, with no change to the contract amount, to provide additional capacity for facility and asset improvements. c) **Supersede** [Resolution No. 26-0019 of February 10, 2026 with CM Pros \(PRO.0254.A\) and with PMA Consultants LLC and Dabri Joint Venture \(PRO.0254.B\); and further approve Amendment No. 2 for Contract Nos. 7. **Approve** the terms and conditions and [authorize the General Manager to execute a no-fee, month-to-month revocable license to the City of Sunnyvale](#) to use approximately 17 acres of SFPUC land, consisting of portions of SFPUC Parcel Nos. 144, 145A, 146, 148, 152, 154B, 156A, 159, and 165, and the entirety of SFPUC Parcel Nos. 145, 149, 150,

151, 153, 154A, 155, 161, 162, and 164 in Sunnyvale, California for (i) operating, maintaining, managing and repairing an existing public recreational pedestrian and bicycle path; (ii) maintaining existing landscaping in accordance with the SFPUC Vegetation Management Policy; (iii) maintaining and repairing a portion of an existing pedestrian and bicycle ramp; (iv) maintaining certain permitted encroachments consisting of light poles, picnic tables, barbecues, and shade structures; (v) maintaining and repairing existing public street crossings; (vi) installing new educational signage regarding the SFPUC water system; (vii) operating, maintaining, and repairing the existing irrigation systems; and (viii) maintaining the existing Manzano Way park area improvements consisting of picnic tables, parkour structures, and a horseshoe pit. 8. **Public Hearing** to consider and possible action to [adopt revised miscellaneous fees for the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission Water Enterprise](#) related to temporary water service through hydrants (Schedule W-41B) and backflow prevention (Schedule W-45). If approved, the proposed fees will become effective on July 1, 2026, and will remain effective until revised by a future Commission action. This action constitutes the Approval Action for the Project for the purposes of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code Section 31.04(h). The Planning Department has determined that the Project is exempt from the CEQA. The Commission will rely on that determination to make its decision on this action. (Hom)

11. **Approve** an increase of \$500,000 to the existing cost contingency and 274 calendar days to the existing duration contingency for [Contract No. HH-1013](#), Moccasin Compound Water System Filtration Addition, with Sierra Mountain Construction, Inc., for a revised cost limit of \$6,595,729 and a revised duration limit of 920 calendar days (approximately two years and six months), to address additional costs and schedule impacts resulting from a change in the foundation design, as well as plant design changes.
