


Geary Boulevard Utility Upgrades

Location: Geary Boulevard between 32nd Avenue and Stanyan Street

Work Segments:

- Segment A: 32nd Avenue to 12th Avenue
- Segment B: 12th Avenue to Stanyan Street





Schedule

November 2024

- Preliminary work in progress
 - Surveying
 - Sewer lateral inspections
 - Started at 32nd Avenue and working east; currently at 28th Avenue
 - Potholing beginning mid-November

December 2024

Baseline schedule submitted

> January 2025

Sewer and water pipeline installation begins



Preliminary Work

Surveying

- Detailed documentation of the existing conditions at a construction site and the surrounding areas
- Photographs and video recordings from multiple vantage points to provide record of the pre-construction state







Preliminary Work

Sewer Lateral Inspections

- Lower laterals inspected where sewer mains will not be rehabilitated or replaced
- Ensure sewer infrastructure along the entire project corridor in state of good repair
- Temporary parking restrictions may be necessary







Preliminary Work

Potholing

- Identify underground utilities and potential conflicts
- No major excavation required
- Temporary parking restrictions may be necessary

*Waivers to work during holiday moratorium needed







Monitoring During Construction

Noise Monitoring

- Contractor will implement mitigation controls to ensure compliance with construction noise levels allowed
- Required for nighttime work

Vibration Monitoring

Contractor will monitor vibration at critical locations as needed


Air Monitoring

 For Cured-In-Place-Liner sewer rehabilitation, air quality around the worksite will be monitored

- Quarterly project updates




