Hayes Valley Sewer Improvements Project

Our Sewer System Upgrades are Underway

The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) operates a combined sewer system that collects and treats San Francisco’s wastewater (sewage and stormwater). Our Sewer System Improvement Program (SSIP) is upgrading and modernizing our system to ensure we can continue to protect public health and the environment now and into the future.

The Hayes Valley Sewer Improvements Project will rehabilitate the existing 100+ year old sewer mains located under the streets highlighted on the Project Map.

Wherever possible and to minimize impacts to the roadway and adjacent residences and businesses, most of the sewer mains will be rehabilitated with a trenchless method called Cured-in-Placed Pipe (CIPP) sfpuc.org/curedpipe. Where CIPP cannot be performed, the sewer mains will be replaced or rehabilitated with open-excavation. Construction will include improvements to sewer lower laterals within the project area, which may also require open-excavation. When completed, this project will increase the reliability of our City’s critical sewer system infrastructure.


Estimated Construction Schedule


Project Locations



Where possible, we use cure-in-place-pipe (CIPP) to reduce the impact and duration of our work in the street. This method can often reduce the duration of work.

What to Expect

- **SEWER SERVICE** These services will NOT be interrupted during construction.
- **PARKING:** Street parking will be impacted near construction zones. “No-parking” signs will be posted 72 hours in advance.
- **TRAFFIC:** Partial lane closures may be necessary to ensure safety of workers and the public. Advance notice and detour signage will be provided, as needed.
- **MUNI:** Passenger loading zone for bus stops may be temporary relocated. Advance notice and detour signage will be provided as needed.
- **ACCESS:** Follow posted signage on site. Driveway access to businesses and residents in the work zone will be maintained during construction.
- **NOISE:** Neighbors may hear construction noise periodically. Noisy work will be conducted in compliance with the San Francisco Noise Ordinance.
- **ODORS:** If necessary, odor control measures will be in place during construction. Please see CIPP page for more information. sfpuc.org/curedpipe
- **NOTICE:** A 30-day and 10-day notice will be distributed prior to construction to residents and businesses within the project area before construction begins.

About the SFPUC & Our Combined Sewer System

We are the San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC), a not-for-profit public utility providing San Francisco with water, power, and sewer services. Every day we collect and treat both sewage and stormwater for homes and businesses to protect public health and the environment. This project is part of the SFPUC's Wastewater Capital Improvement Program to upgrade and modernize San Francisco's combined sewer system for current and future generations.
