Stormwater Improvement Capital Projects

- These investments are vital, but they're not a cure-all -> we have resources for residents and businesses to reduce flood risk

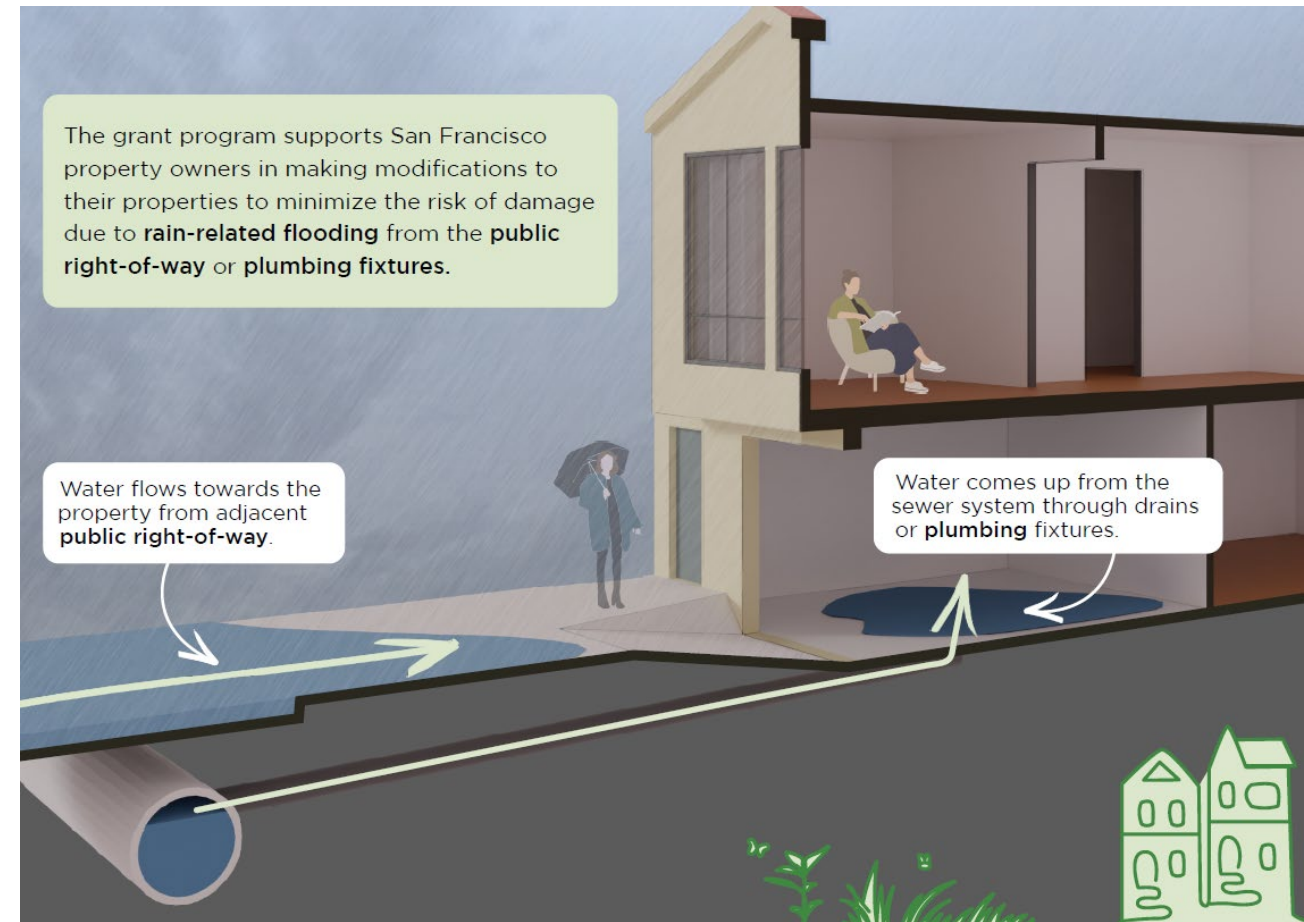

Floodwater Grant Program

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- Grants for San Francisco property owners that have experienced prior flooding events where floodwater entered the property from:
 - the public right-of-way and/or
 - the Combined Sewer System through a backflow event
- For installation of flood protection measures that will help keep water out and/or minimize flooding damage on the property



Eligibility Requirements

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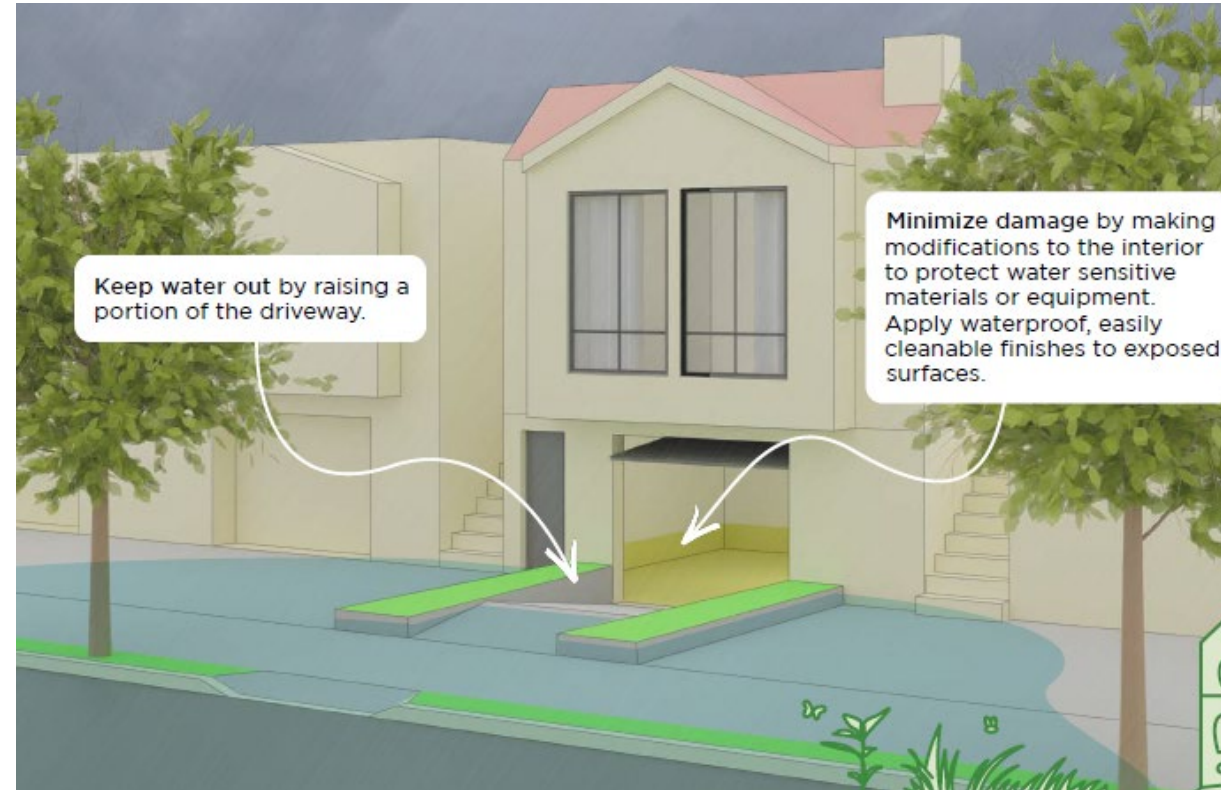
- A flood event has occurred on your property where water entered from the sidewalk, street, or sewer system via a backflow event
- Floodwater Grant site visit confirming property conditions



Other Requirements to Consider

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- Property owner to sign grant application & agreement
- Must have an active SFPUC wastewater account
- Proposed flood protection measures will protect against eligible flood event
- Any project activities must take place within the timeline outlined in the signed grant agreement to be eligible for reimbursement.



What the grant covers

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- Up to \$100,000 for eligible flood protection project costs. This includes but is not limited to
 - Construction costs
 - Materials
 - Permit fees
 - Shipping and installation of prefabricated products such as deployable flood barriers
- Grant funds are dispersed on a reimbursement basis



What the grant does not cover

- Remediation or repair from flooding damages
- On-site maintenance and repairs such as roof repairs or clogged pipes
- Repairs to the sewer lateral (see link below for more information)

- Any work completed prior to a fully signed grant agreement and funding approval letter is received

Financial Assistance

- Financial assistance is available to those who qualify:
 - owners who have demonstrated that they are experiencing financial hardship
 - small businesses or nonprofits with no more than 50 full-time employees
 - 10% installment payment to hire contractor
 - Upfront disbursements for remainder of grant

****Proof of payment and progress photos are required within 30 days**

Required Documentation

For owner-occupied residential property owners, to be approved for this program, the City must be able to determine your receipt of public benefits.

Option 1: Applicants may provide SFPUC with the option to look up their limited income eligibility with the Human Services Agency (HSA) and give permission to HSA to share the applicant's income information.

- ☐ I give permission to HSA to share limited income information with SFPUC. My information shall be shared only as needed to determine whether I qualify for SFPUC's Floodwater Grant Hardship Payment Option. I understand that this database can only show my name, my address, and whether my household income falls within certain percentages of federal poverty guidelines, based on information I have previously provided to HSA.

Option 2: Applicants may provide proof of their hardship through their own supporting documentation.

Check one or all of the program(s) from which you receive public benefits. Attach to this form supporting documentation to prove that you receive public benefits from each program.

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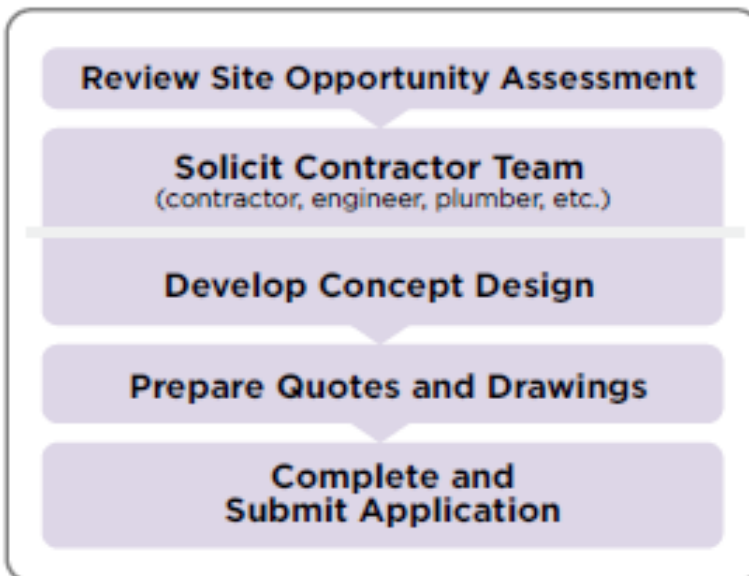

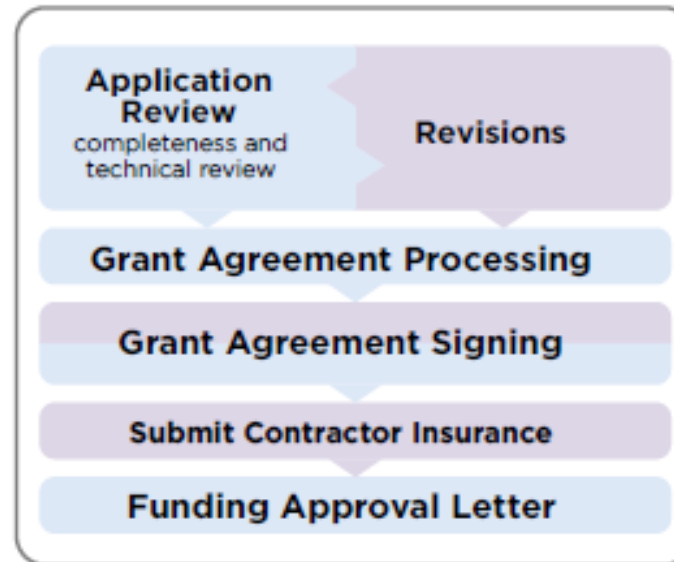

1. Review the Grant Guidebook & submit an interest form

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- Access the grant guidebook & submit an interest form online at

<https://www.sfpuc.gov/programs/grants/floodwater-management-grant-program>

- Include detailed description of prior eligible flooding
- Send any photos using link provided via email after survey submittal
- Renter may submit, but owner must apply

Floodwater Grant Interest Form

The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) Floodwater Management Grant Program helps property owners in San Francisco to minimize the risk of sewer backflow and overland flooding on their properties due to heavy rainstorms.

2. Site Visit

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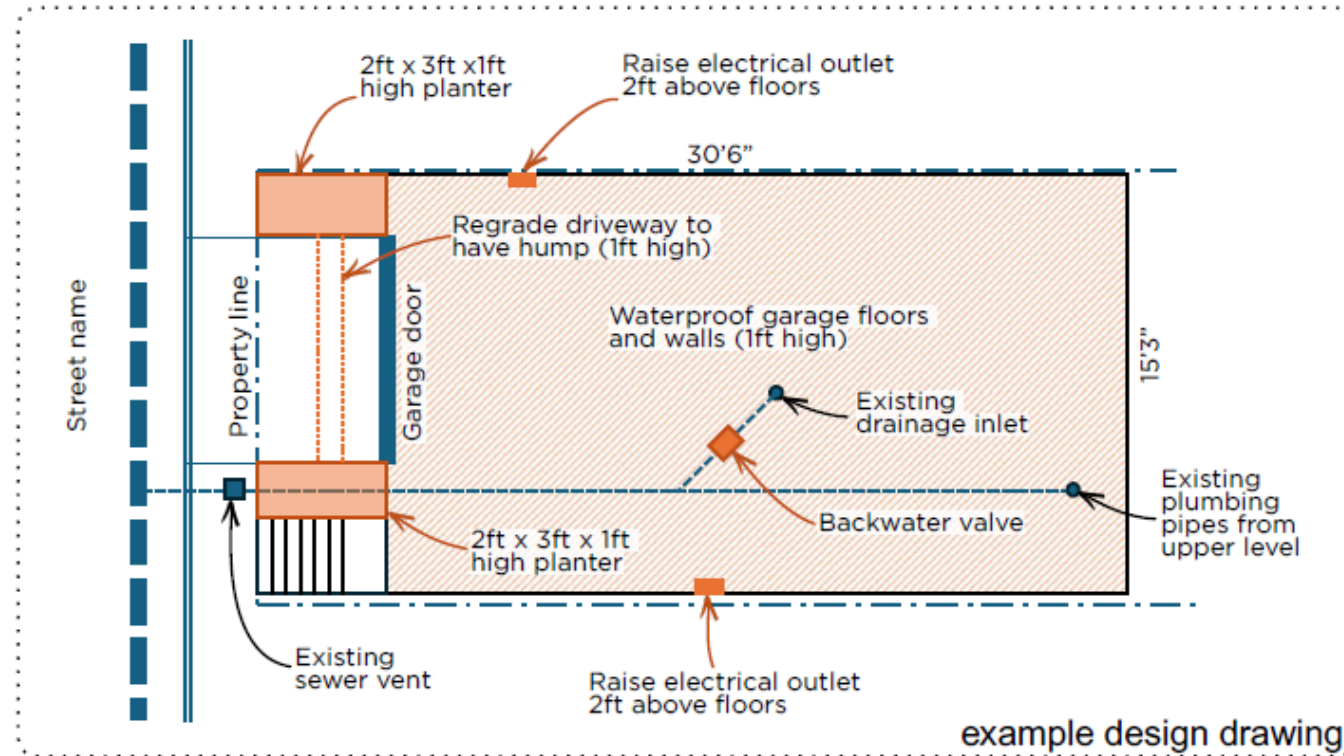
- Grant team will reach out to schedule a site visit on property
 - Technical staff will attend
 - Make detailed observations about property conditions
- Follow up visit with Department of Building Inspection may be necessary for plumbing assessment
- Grant team will send a Site Opportunity Assessment with observations, eligibility to apply, example flood protection measures, and application resources



3. Prepare a Grant Application

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- Engage appropriate contractors
- Determine project design
- Obtain at least 2 competitive quotes from contractors for scope of work
 - Selected quote must be within 10% of lowest quote or grantee pays the difference
- Obtain drawing from selected contractor
- Complete application & send along with supporting documentation to FloodwaterGrants@sfwater.org



3. Sign Grant Agreement

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- SFPUC drafts grant agreement
- SFPUC sends agreement to applicant via DocuSign
- Once signed, city staff will review and countersign
- A fully executed grant agreement will be sent to the grantee



Build project

- Grantee sends required contractors' insurance
- Funding Approval Letter will be issued to grantee granting permission to begin the project
 - Any work done before the Funding Approval Letter is issued will not be eligible for reimbursement
- Grantee can pull permits and contractors can begin construction

*Document and save construction activities for payment requests (photos of work, invoices and receipts)



Payment requests & final site visit

- Submit Payment Request Form (included in the grant agreement appendices)


- Reimbursement payments can be requested multiple times throughout the project

Project Grant Amount	Number of Allowable Payments
up to \$30,000	Eligible for up to two payments
from \$30,001 up to \$50,000	Eligible for up to three payments
from \$50,001 up to \$100,000	Eligible for up to five payments

- Must provide permits, documentation of work done, proof of payment and construction invoices marked as paid by the contractor (we will verify with contractor)

Financial Assistance: If you have been approved for financial assistance, proof of payment and project progress documentation must be provided within 30 days of receipt of installment payments. Final site visit must take place within 30 days of final installment payment.

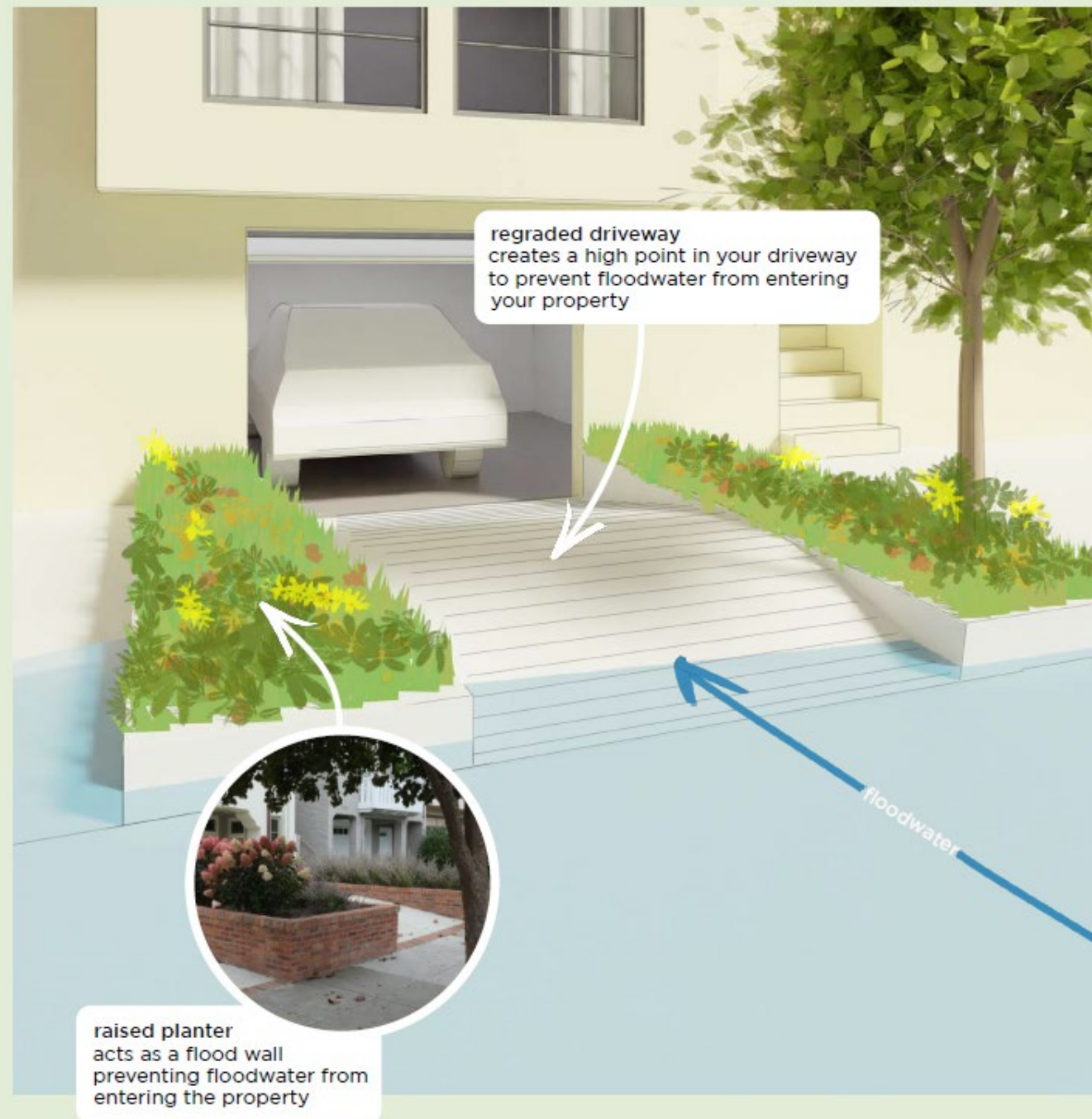

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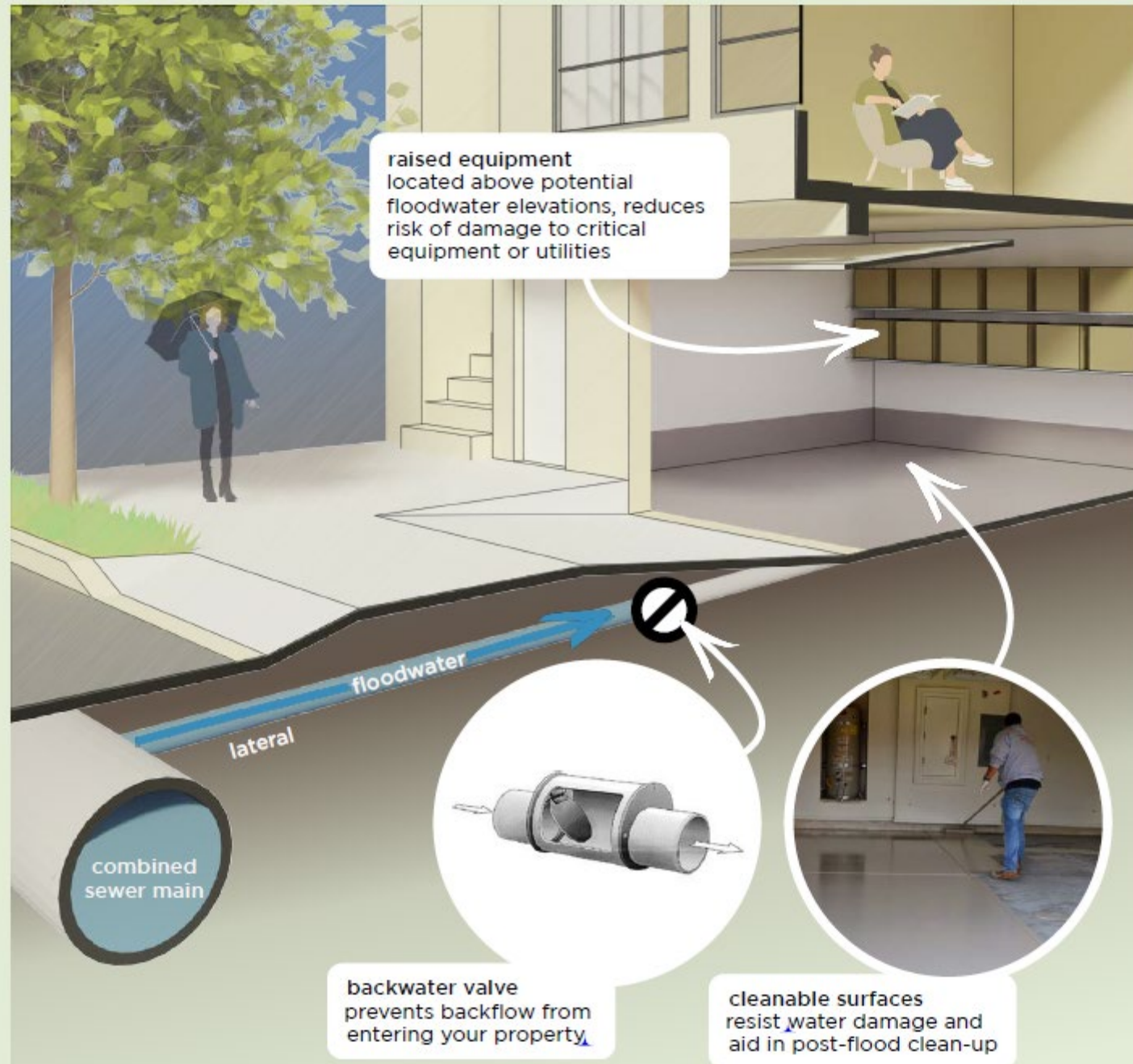

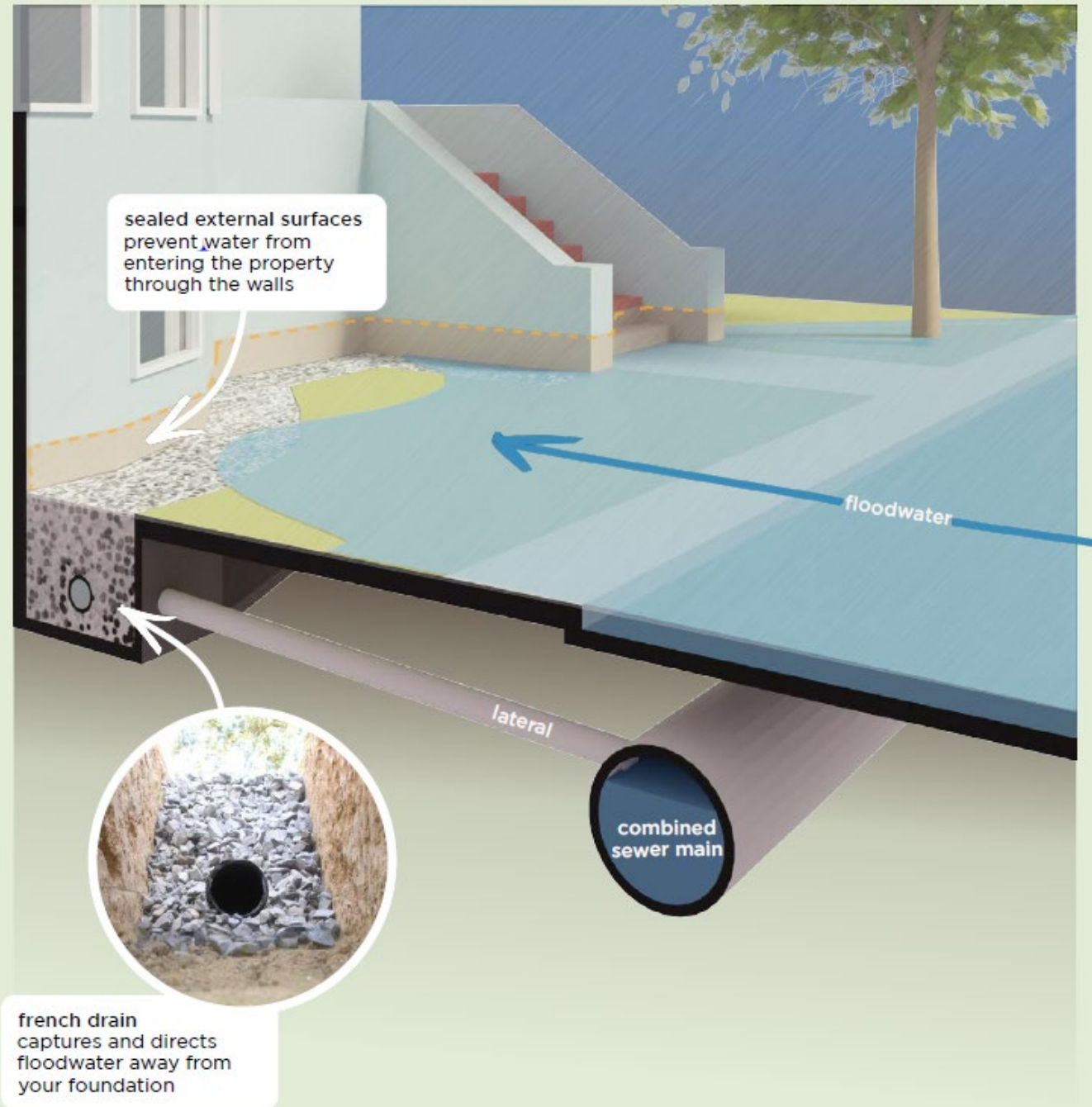
Regraded Driveway with Raised Planters



Backwater Valve, Cleanable Surfaces, Raised Equipment



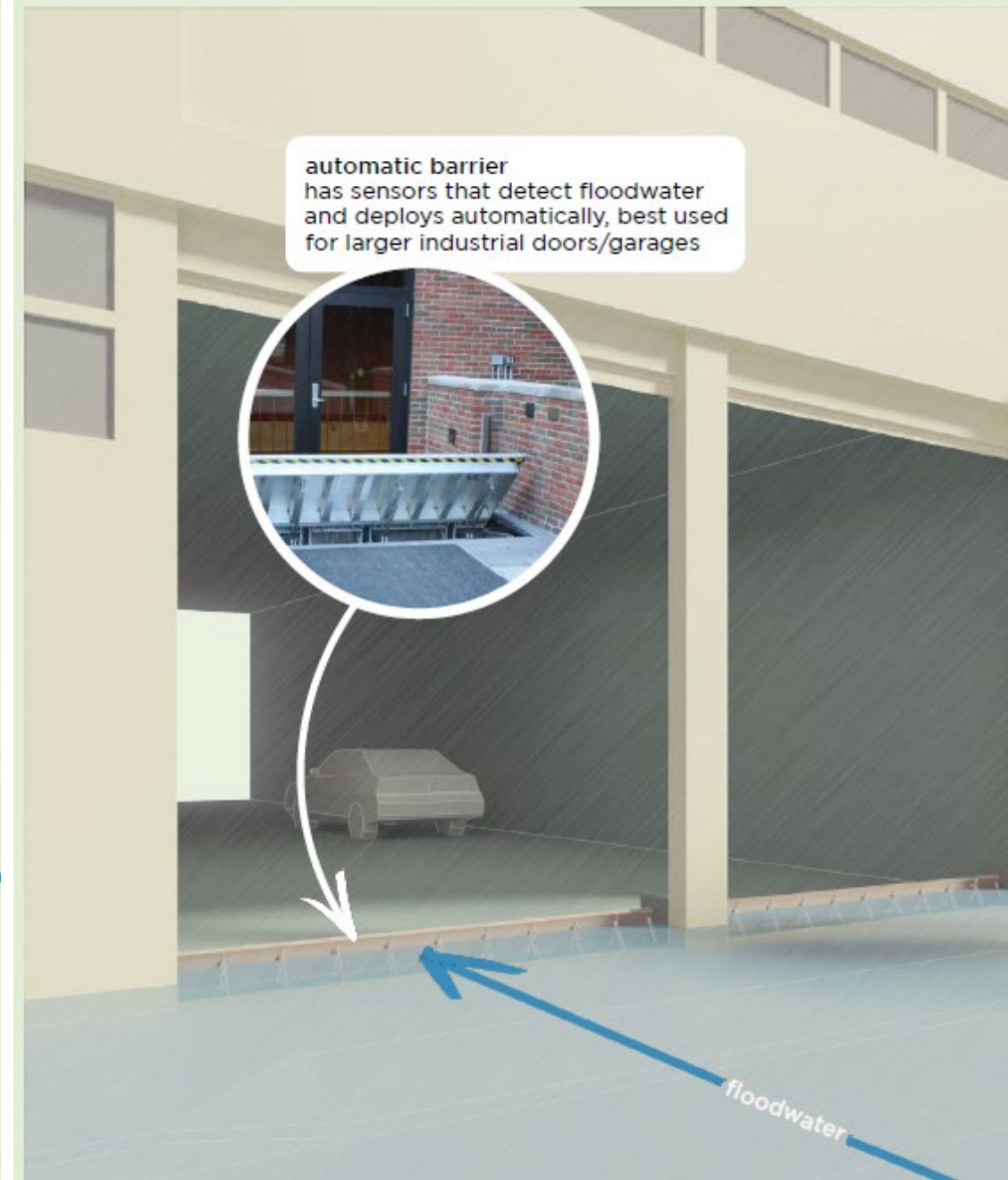
French Drain with Sealed External Surfaces

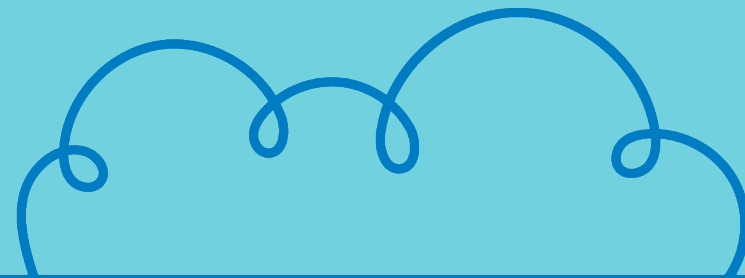
