• Chair McKinney asked, is pollution prevention messaging reported out in a report?

Staff Cleave answered, if it is a regulatory requirement it is reported out in an annual report. If it is not a regulatory requirement but related, then we include it in an amendment.

Chair McKinney asked, in terms of permit requirements, what is the minimum requirements for pollution prevention?
 Staff Cleave stated, it's a combination of different ways of reporting and meeting the requirements of combined ecuar permits recording energies.

meeting the requirements of combined sewer permits regarding specific pollutants. There are different requirements depending the permits.

 Chair McKinney asked, with a rise of homelessness due to COVID-19, specifically in the Bayview Hunters Point neighborhood, how is pollution prevention being addressed.

Staff Cleave replied, we partner with Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing but we have not yet developed a direct communication strategy.

Staff Cleave: SFPUC and Public Works have cleaning mechanisms in place to protect litter in storm drains. We also have created more communications materials around pollution prevention specifically around gloves and masks.

Staff Franks answered, the entire structure of the credits will be measured by the performance of the green infrastructure added on to the building classification.

 Member Nagengast asked is the credit given to infrastructure projects to incorporate green infrastructure solutions sufficient enough to drive a positive environmental change?

Staff Franks replied, there are grants that can cover upfront costs. As for longer term for return on investments that's not funded by grants, it may be harder to regain those costs. There is a balance that the user has to strike.
